Irma May Have Been the Bigger Storm, but the Damage from Harvey's Storm Surge Will Last for Years

Hurricanes Harvey & Irma are the only Category 4 Atlantic storms to ever hit the USA in the same year-let alone the same two weeks.

Harvey dumped an unprecedented 27 trillion gallons of water on Texas and Louisiana. Parts of Houston received almost 53 inches of rain, breaking a record for rainfall.

Irma left at least 23 dead in the United States. And, while it's unlikely to rival the damage seen in flood-prone Houston, pockets from Jacksonville, Florida, to Charleston, South Carolina, experienced historic deluges.

The storms seem likely to have caused \$150 billion to \$200 billion in total damage to homes and furnishings, vehicles, commercial real estate, and public infrastructure. This is comparable to the property loss resulting from
